COVID VACCINE ACCESSIBILITY

There should be no Profit on Pandemics. We want a vaccine and treatment for all, because faced with a pandemic, everyone has the right to a cure. A collective threat requires a collective response. Researchers around the world are developing vaccines and treatments, often using huge sums of public money. Intellectual property rights, such as patents, should not be allowed to limit rapid accessibility of vaccines and treatments for all.

The Global Catholic Climate Movement launched an online petition on May 17 as part of Laudato Si' Week, calling on world leaders who will take part in the U.N. Biodiversity Conference (COP15) in October and the U.N. Climate Change Conference (COP26) in November. “There has never been a more urgent need to revive damaged ecosystems than now. Ecosystems support all life on Earth. The healthier our ecosystems are, the healthier the planet - and its people. The UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration aims to prevent, halt and reverse the degradation of ecosystems on every continent and in every ocean. It can help to end poverty, combat climate change and prevent a mass extinction. It will only succeed if everyone plays a part.” (United Nations)

On the 5 June we celebrate World Environment Day. This year also marks the official launch of the [UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration](#), a 10-year push to stop and to reverse the rapid decline of our natural world.

Of Bees, Balance and the Bible

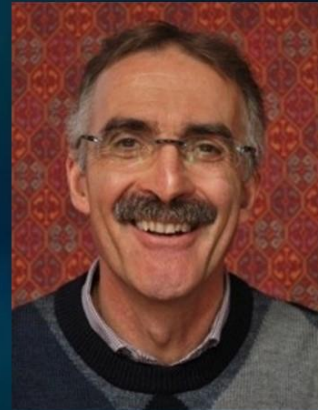
A conversation between creation, scripture and the human experience
