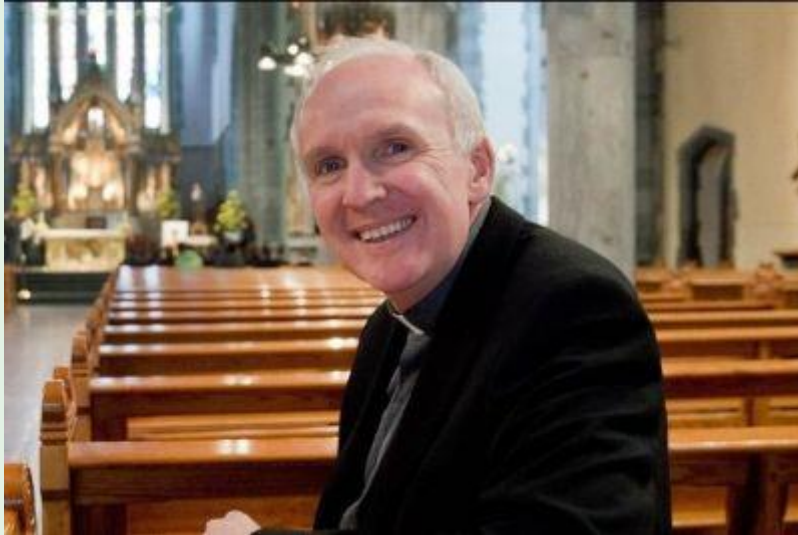
AMRI has received a request from an AMRI member seeking support for a Somalian family residing in Ireland for the last 10 years, who are living in unsuitable accommodation for their needs.



Currently the family are living in a 3rd floor 3-bed apartment,(homeless accommodation) with 4 children and a grandmother. One of the boys has severe autism and another boy has a profound physical disability with complex medical needs who attends Menni Services.

A message to AMRI members from Bishop Brendan Leahy



Dear AMRI Members

I write to let you know of an initiative being organised jointly by the Advisory Committee to the Irish Episcopal Conference on Interreligious Dialogue and Veritas. The Advisory Committee was established with the aim of strengthening our engagement as Church in Ireland in the field of respectful and constructive dialogue with people of other faiths.

Members of the Committee are Bishop Brendan Leahy (Chair), Fr Alan Hillard, Ms Aiveen Mulally and Sr Kathleen McGarvey OLA.

**Each diocese and religious institute
is invited to ask one representative,
preferably their nominated Director/Secretary
for Interreligious dialogue,
to attend a zoom conference on April 22nd from 15.30-
17.00.**

The primary objective of this zoom conference is to look together at the issues and questions surrounding the diversity of religions present in Ireland today,

and consider ways in which our engagement in the promotion of interreligious dialogue can be strengthened.

The meeting will include

- 1) a look at what the Church is saying today about interreligious dialogue especially in the light of the Abu Dhabi document;
- 2) the issue of students of different faiths in catholic schools;
- 3) general pastoral issues.

The participation of a representative from your Religious Institute will be very much appreciated.

AMRI Covid Response

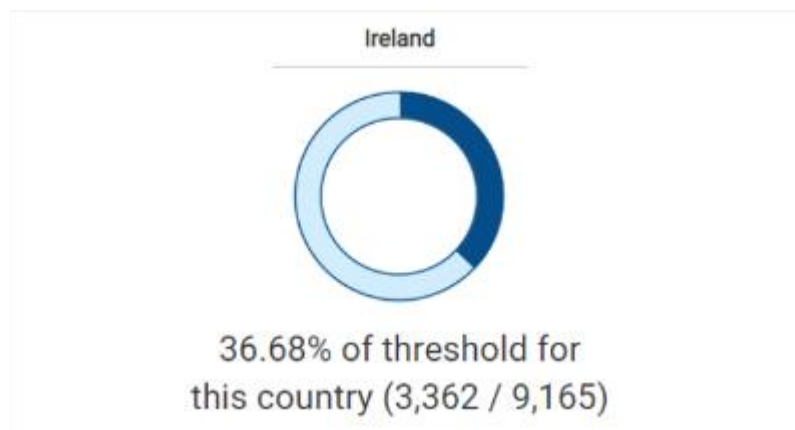

Earth Hour: Saturday March 27th 2021

Each year on the last Saturday of March since 2007, millions of people across the world join together in raising awareness of the environmental issues and challenges facing our planet and as a reminder of our call to action.

This Saturday at 8.30pm, consider joining the millions of others across 180 countries and territories in switching off your lights to demonstrate your solidarity in responding to the ‘cry of the earth’.

Earth Hour which was started by the World Wildlife Fund and partners has become one of the world's largest grassroots movements for the environment. While switching off lights at 8.30pm began as a symbolic action of awareness and solidarity, Earth Hour has since expanded into a “catalyst for positive environmental impact, driving major legislative changes by harnessing the power of the people and collective action”.
