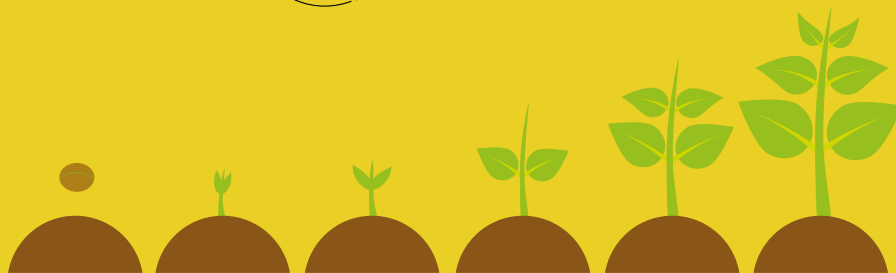

During this season of lent we invite you to reflect and act on what may be the ultimate challenge of humankind. It will be a response to Pope Francis' call in his encyclical *Laudato Si', on the care for our common home* where the Pope affirms: *"The ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion. Christians all need an "ecological conversion", whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them."* (LS 217)

Use this calendar either as a team or as an individual to track your ecological actions throughout the season of lent.

Included in the calendar are some suggestions including:

- Meat free or meat and fish free days
- Take the Climate Fresk (Climate Collage) workshop
- Swapping the car for active or public transport
- Include Caring for our common Home in your prayer
- Parish as Oasis book club
- Plant native trees, flowers or seeds for food
- Avoid plastic drinks bottles
- Practicing Irish
- Reducing food waste
